V. Approval of Previous Minutes:

1. Regular Council Meeting – December 15, 2025

Councilmember Lynn made a motion to approve the minutes of December 15, 2025, as written. Councilmember Overstreet seconded the motion. There was no discussion on the motion, and the vote was unanimous.

VI. Approval of Bills - Per List

Councilmember Hollingsworth questioned the Suncoast Infrastructure 2024 CDBG Sewer Rehab line item. Lewis Shealy, Chief Financial Officer, explained that this is a partial payment on the Sewer Rehab Project. Councilmember Hollingsworth made a motion to accept the bills for payment as presented. Councilmember Lynn seconded the motion. Councilmember Kitchens asked about Island Glassworks, and Scott Gilbert, Public Works Director, mentioned that this was for restoration at the Splash Pad. The vote was unanimous.

VIII. Presentations:

1. Robertsdale Youth Baseball League – Lacey Wood

Lacey Wood addressed the Council, asking for the use of the billboard for their registration and community sponsorship. She discussed the need for improvements to field lighting, the addition of batting cages, and path lighting for the restroom access near the splash pad.

Scott Bankster, Electric Foreman, mentioned that they can install path lighting, and the new LED field lights have been shipped and will be installed later this month. Councilmember Kitchens asked if the softball league would be interested in using the billboard for their registration as well. It was discussed that someone would reach out to the softball league to let them know it would be available. Councilmember Hollingsworth made a motion to allow the Robertsdale Youth Baseball League to use the billboard for their registration and to promote their community outreach sponsorship. Councilmember Overstreet seconded the motion. There was no discussion on the motion, and the vote was unanimous.

2. Clint Raymond Alvear – Discuss Closing of East Chicago Street

Mayor Campbell explained that he discussed this during the workshop meeting and what he would like to see done, which was leave the street open and only close it during an event. She also mentioned that he has met with the architects on this project, and she will schedule a meeting with him on Tuesday.

3. Central Baldwin Girls Softball League (Added to the Agenda)

Councilmember Hollingsworth made a motion to allow the Softball League to advertise its registration on the billboard if so desired. Councilmember Lynn seconded the motion. There was no discussion on the motion. The vote was unanimous.

X. New Business:

1. Proposed Creation of a Community Development Department

Mark Fincher, Building Official, discussed at the workshop meeting the creation of this department, separating the planning, zoning, and building from the Engineering Department. This department will focus on long-term planning, beautification, and infrastructure coordination. Councilmember Hollingsworth made a motion to create the Community Development Department, and that the Building Official be the head of this department, and not receive any more money. Councilmember Overstreet mentioned that he would be receiving department head pay if promoted to a department head. Mr. Fincher stated that there would be a salary adjustment. Mayor Campbell asked Councilmember Hollingsworth if his motion was to then just create the department, and Councilmember Hollingsworth stated yes, that his motion is to create the Community Development Department. Councilmember Lynn seconded the motion. For discussion, Mr. Fincher stated that if he were the new department head, his increase would be an additional \$22,350.00. After further discussion, Councilmember Kitchens made a motion to amend Councilmember Hollingsworth's motion to table this for two weeks. Councilmember Overstreet seconded the motion. There was no discussion, and the motion carried.

2. Appointment of Connie Glassford to Fill a Vacancy on the Industrial Development Board

Councilmember Manning made a motion to appoint Connie Glassford to the vacancy on the Industrial Development Board. Councilmember Kitchens seconded the motion. Councilmember Hollingsworth mentioned that she will be an excellent addition to the board. There were no other nominations, and the vote was unanimous.

3. Appointment of City Attorney

Mayor Campbell recommended reappointing Ken Raines as City Attorney. Councilmember Kitchens made a motion to approve the recommendation. Councilmember Manning seconded the motion. There were no other nominations, and the vote was unanimous.

4. Appointment of City Prosecutor

Mayor Campbell recommended reappointing Ken Raines as City Prosecutor. Councilmember Overstreet made a motion to approve the recommendation. Councilmember Lynn seconded the motion. There was no discussion on the motion, and no other nominations. The vote was unanimous.

XI. Reports of Officers/Departments/Committees:

Mayor Campbell thanked the department heads for their reports provided during the workshop meeting.

XII. Resolutions and Ordinances:

1. Resolution No. 001-2026 – Amending the Classification Plan of the Personnel Policy

Councilmember Overstreet made a motion to adopt Resolution No. 001-2026. Councilmember Manning seconded the motion. There was no discussion. The vote was unanimous. APPENDIX II

2. Ordinance No. 001-2026 – High-Density and Subdivision Moratorium

Motion was made by Councilmember Hollingsworth, seconded by Councilmember Overstreet, to suspend the rules to allow for the immediate passage of this ordinance at this meeting, and the same passed and adopted by unanimous vote of the Council. Roll call vote revealed: Ayes: Mayor Campbell, Councilmembers Kitchens, Manning, Lynn, Overstreet, Hollingsworth. Nay: None. Motion carried.

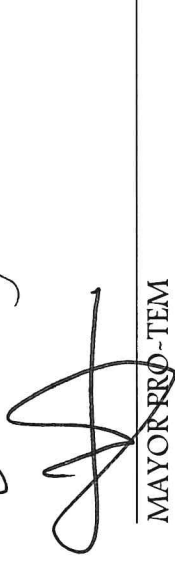

RESOLUTION NO. 001-2026

Amending the Classification Plan Established in Section 12.001 of the City of Robertsdale Personnel Policy

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROBERTSDALE, ALABAMA, as follows:

Whereas the personnel committee has reviewed the Classification Plan setting forth the pay ranges for full-time employees established and referenced in section 12.001 of the City of Robertsdale Personnel Policy and upon review and study of said Classification Plan by the Chief Financial Officer, it has been recommended that a grade 12 be established beginning with a minimum starting pay, and then setting a maximum pay range consisting of 26 steps (EL to 25).

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By the City Council of the City of Robertsdale as follows:

The Classification Plan attached as Exhibit A is adopted for the pay ranges for full-time employees which amends the current Classification Plan by establishing grade 12 with a minimum starting pay and then setting a maximum pay range consisting of 26 steps (EL to 25). All other grades and pay ranges set forth in the Classification Plan currently in place shall remain the same.

CITY OF ROBERTSDALE
ORDINANCE NO. 001-2026

AN ORDINANCE TO PROTECT THE HEALTH, SAFETY, AND GENERAL WELFARE OF THE PEOPLE OF ROBERTSDALE, BY TEMPORARILY SUSPENDING CONSIDERATION OR APPROVAL OF CERTAIN TYPES OF RESIDENTIAL PROJECTS, CERTAIN TYPES OF RESIDENTIAL REZONING REQUESTS, CERTAIN TYPES OF RESIDENTIAL SITE PLAN APPROVALS, AND CERTAIN TYPE OF RESIDENTIAL SUBDIVISION APPLICATIONS BY THE CITY OF ROBERTSDALE AND ITS PLANNING COMMISSION, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the City of Robertsdale has adopted certain regulations, ordinances, codes, policies and procedures which regulate the subdivision of land and the development and approval of various types of residential projects and developments; and

WHEREAS, there has been rapid, sustained, and substantial growth in residential housing units in and around the City of Robertsdale; and

WHEREAS, the City Council recognizes and hereby finds, that the rapid, sustained, and substantial growth in residential housing units and construction has increased, and will continue to increase the burdens on the City of Robertsdale to provide municipal services, first responder services, infrastructure, transportation, parks, recreation, and other governmental services beyond what was anticipated by the City of Robertsdale; and

WHEREAS, the City Council desires to address certain challenges created by the growth with the strategic and deliberate focus on orderly land development in the City limits; and

WHEREAS, the City is in the process of taking several steps to address the rapid and substantial growth over the next 6 months, including but not limited to exploration and completion of additional construction and installation of millions of dollars of new water and wastewater infrastructure and facilities to increase service levels and capacity; completion of upgrades and extensions to existing water and wastewater infrastructure and facilities to increase service levels and capacity; completion and analysis of water and wastewater sewer capacity studies; consideration of amendments to the existing Robertsdale Subdivision Regulations, Comprehensive Plan, and Zoning Ordinance; and review of traffic and parking concerns; and

WHEREAS, the City Council believes the short-term suspension on consideration and approval of certain types of residential development and subdivision applications will allow the City staff, City Council, Planning Commission, and outside consultants to evaluate and focus on these specific steps to address the identified challenges; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that the suspension on consideration of these types of residential dwelling developments and certain subdivision applications is appropriate to prevent conditions that may threaten the community’s health, safety, and general welfare; and

WHEREAS, the suspension of limited duration and limited scope would be in the public interest and promote orderly land development.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ROBERTSDALE, ALABAMA AS FOLLOWS:

Section I: Recitals

That the City Council hereby adopts the findings in the above recitals.

Section II. Purpose

The City Council hereby declares it to be the purpose and intent of this Ordinance to enact a temporary suspension of consideration for each of the following types of applications or requests, except as expressly allowed herein:

- a. Residential developments that contain one or more Duplexes, Two Family Dwellings, Townhouse, Garden Home or Multiple-Family Dwellings;
- b. Mixed-use developments that contain one or more Duplexes, Two Family Dwellings, Townhouse, Garden Home or Multi-Family Dwellings;
- c. Planned Unit Developments, Planned Development Districts, or similar planned developments that contain one or more Duplexes, Two Family Dwellings, Townhouse, or Multi-Family Dwellings;
- d. Subdivision applications for land that would contain or result in the creation of three (3) or more residential lots;
- e. Rezoning applications that would either create new residential zoning areas or increase the dwelling unit density of residentially zoned property, whether through traditional zoning or through Planned Developments or mixed-use districts;
- f. Site plan approval applications for residential developments of over three (3) residential lots or over three (3) dwelling units;
- g. Approvals for new or expanded Recreational Vehicle (RV) Parks; and
- h. Approvals for new or expanded Mobile or Manufactured Home Parks.

Section III: Temporary Suspension Established

A. For the purposes of evaluating traffic and parking burden, water and wastewater capacity, and other impacts and problems facing the City that may be caused or which could be exacerbated by additional high density residential dwelling developments, and to allow for the analysis and development of related updates to the City’s comprehensive plan and applicable rules, regulations, and ordinances, and to identify, provide for, and address the City’s roadways, utility infrastructure, and other needs, the City Council hereby suspends consideration of all applications or requests for the following:

- a. Residential developments that contain one or more Duplexes, Two Family Dwellings, Townhouse, Garden Home or Multiple-Family Dwellings;
- b. Mixed-use developments that contain one or more Duplexes, Two Family Dwellings, Townhouse, Garden Home or Multi-Family Dwellings;
- c. Planned Unit Developments, Planned Development Districts, or similar planned developments that contain one or more Duplexes, Two Family Dwellings, Townhouse, or Multi-Family Dwellings (including modifications for previous approved ones);
- d. Subdivision applications for land that would contain or result in the creation of three (3) or more residential lots;
- e. Rezoning applications that would either create new residential zoning areas or increase the dwelling unit density of residentially zoned property, whether through traditional zoning or through Planned Developments or mixed use districts;
- f. Site plan approval applications for residential developments of over three (3) residential lots or over three (3) dwelling units;
- g. Approvals for new or expanded Recreational Vehicle (RV) Parks; and
- h. Approvals for new or expanded Mobile or Manufactured Home Parks.

The duration of this Ordinance shall be six (6) months from the effective date of this Ordinance.

B. The City and the Planning Commission shall not accept or consider any new residential development applications and subdivision applications or requests for projects as set forth in Section III A. herein. Concurrent with the effectiveness hereof, all timelines set forth in the Subdivision Regulations that relate to such applications, including consideration, review, recommendation, hearing, and decision shall be suspended.

- C. This Ordinance shall not affect any complete residential development applications and subdivision application as set forth in Section III A. herein that has been submitted to the City Planning Department with the fee paid on or before the effective date of this Ordinance.

Section IV. Conflict and Severability

- A. This Ordinance shall be construed in a manner that does not conflict with any provision of local, state or federal law except as expressly provided herein and except to the extent its provisions are more restrictive.
- B. In the event that any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance shall be declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall in no manner affect the other sections, sentences, clauses or phrases of this Ordinance, which shall remain in full force and effect, as if the section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase so declared or adjudged invalid or unconstitutional were not originally a part thereof.

Section V: Definitions

Unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, for the purposes of this article, the following words, combinations of words, terms and phrases shall have the following meanings:

- A. “City” – means the City of Robertsdale, an Alabama municipal corporation.
- B. “City Council” – means the elected members of the City of Robertsdale, Alabama.
- C. “Planning Commission” – means the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Robertsdale, Alabama.
- D. “Subdivision Regulations” – means the City of Robertsdale’s Subdivision Regulations.
- E. “Effective Date” means this ordinance shall take effect upon its due adoption and publication as required by law.

Section VI: Miscellaneous.

- A. Headings: All headings contained in this Ordinance are for reference only and shall not limit, modify or affect the meaning or interpretation of this Ordinance in any matter.
- B. Power and Authority: The City of Robertsdale has the power and authority to adopt and enforce the terms, conditions and regulations established in this Ordinance pursuant to its police powers to protect the public health, safety, moral and general public welfare of the community.
